
For students who are hard of hearing, have dyslexia, or need support focusing, Teams can detect what's said in a class session or meeting and present realtime captions with speaker attribution.

To help English Language Learners, Teams automatically translates messages into the language specified in your personal settings.



Together Mode places class members or participants together in a virtual space—helping students feel more connected and reducing cognitive load.


